## **Change to Clinical Case Definition**

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of a change to the clinical case definition for COVID-19.

- From Monday 18<sup>th</sup> May 2020 the UK Chief Medical Officers have updated the clinical case definition to include Anosmia (loss of normal sense of smell or taste). The new definition is now:
  - New continuous cough <u>OR</u> fever <u>OR</u> loss of / change in sense of smell or taste
- Everyone, including health and social care workers, should self-isolate if they develop a new continuous cough or fever or loss of/ change in smell or taste.
- 3. The individual's household should also self-isolate for 14 days as per the current guidelines. The individual should stay at home for 7 days from the onset of their symptoms **and** until they no longer have a fever.
- 4. <u>Guidance</u> issued by Public Health Scotland will be updated to reflect this change to the case definition. Public facing information is available through <u>NHS Inform</u>.
