As we enter 2024, we would like to underline that the LMC will continue to work both locally and nationally to pursue policies that will help and sustain vital GP services. Practice Situation Survey

Since our December newsletter, we have been sending out a weekly, one question survey to practice managers asking them to gauge the level of pressure experienced by their practice over the past week. We are aware that many practices are experiencing significant workload demand and practice pressures. We are keen to monitor the situation in general practice in GGC and to allow us to feed back locally and nationally. The survey is anonymous and should take practice managers less than a minute to complete. The weekly email notes the data that is coming into the office. We would like to thank practice managers for their ongoing assistance with this.

GP Subcommittee/LMC Election

The paperwork for the GP Subcommittee/LMC election will be distributed by the board next week to GPs' email addresses, including the details of the vacancies in each area. In this election, we welcome GPs working as GP Partners and in Salaried roles within practices, and seek to provide a representative committee working in an inclusive and consensual manner. Please note that we do have seats for Sessional GP representatives and elections for these seats will be held in 2026.

GP Workforce Survey

The GP Workforce Survey data for Scotland was published in December. The data shows that since 2013 there has been a reduction of almost 200 whole time equivalent GPs in Scotland (5.35%). This has occurred over a decade when Scotland has seen a growth in population and changing demographics, and as a result the work coming to general practice has increased in complexity and quantity.

The LMC continues to call on the Scottish Government to urgently increase the whole-time equivalent GP workforce and ensure that general practice is sustainable and safe for patients, GPs and their staff.
