Widening of Covid Testing

The public are now able to book a PCR Covid test on the advice of a GP. <u>The Scottish</u> <u>Government letter</u> is linked below in the Highlight list.

The testing criteria has been widened to include circumstances where a GP or healthcare profession has deemed it necessary to get a test. The tests continue to be <u>booked online</u> or by calling 0800 028 2816. If the person needs help to book a test, they can call 0300 303 2713.

2018 GP Contract

We have reached the 3 year mark of the 2018 New GP Contract. <u>The Memorandum of</u> <u>Understanding</u> that underpinned the implementation of the new services was published in November 2017. This expired at the end of March 2021.

<u>The Joint Letter from the BMA and Scottish Government</u> was agreed in December 2020 to take forward the Contract implementation. This details the workplan for the next 2 to 3 years. The headlines of the Joint Letter-

Vaccination Services: all immunisations to be removed from the GP Contract regulations by October 2021. All historic income from vaccinations to be transferred to the Global Sum in 2022/23. Transitionary arrangements/funding apply if not in place.

Pharmacotherapy: all practices to received Level 1 service by 2022/23. Transitionary arrangements apply if not in place.

Community Treatment and Care Services: all practices to have access to CTAC service by 2022/23. Transitionary arrangements apply if not in place.

Urgent Care service: all practices to have an Urgent Care Service by 2023/24.

The timescales and the delivery of services are ambitious and will be challenging. The LMC and GP subcommittee will continue to work with the Health Board and HSCPs in the many Boardwide and HSCP groups to push implementation of the services and deployment of staff in practices.
