To All GPs and GP Practices

The COP26 summit will take place in Glasgow on 31st October to 12th November. With the anticipated attendance of 140 world leaders and 25,000 delegates as well as climate activists, organisers are planning for significant impact and disruptions to normal travel. GP practices have been asked to plan ahead and information has been sent out in the last few weeks-

Some road closures around the SEC conference event have already started but the majority of the affected routes will be closed this coming week. The <u>Get Ready Glasgow website</u> has up to date information of about traffic and travel changes and we would encourage all practices to check their local situation.

COP26- Emergency Supply of medicines from Community Pharmacies

COP26 will see high numbers of non-GGC UK residents and overseas visitors coming into the city. The emergency supply of routine repeat medicines for these visitors is a service that can be provided by community pharmacies without the need to approach GP practices. We have been working with the Board on this issue and <u>guidance for community pharmacies</u> has been developed and published.

This includes information on services that can be accessed at community pharmacies for visitors to the city

*Patients from the rest of the UK/<u>EEA</u>/Switzerland can obtain up to 30 days of emergency supply of medication (special rules for CDs and phenobarbital). Those from outside EEA/Switzerland cannot be supplied prescription-only-medicines without a prescription.

Covid Vaccine Exemption

The Covid passport is now mandatory for certain large events and nightclubs. <u>NHS Inform</u> has information for those who have questions about the passport and about exemptions. The Covid Status Helpline on **0808 196 8565** is also available for the public.

GP practices are not involved in providing exemptions.

Those who are medically exempt will be identified centrally. The Scottish Government have said that a very small number of people cannot be vaccinated for medical reasons. Those patients will receive a paper medical exemption certificate in the post.

Vaccinations

The Board and HSCPs are delivering flu and Covid vaccinations. At this time, other vaccinations including shingles, pneumococcal and travel remain within GP practices until they are formally transferred out.

All GPs and practice staff now have access to the <u>NHS Inform booking portal</u> for flu vaccination and Covid-19 booster. There are 18 community locations across GGC available for booking and staff can book clinics in other health board areas too. Appointments are being added weekly so if there aren't appointments for your preferred site, please go back into the website regularly to check for new availability.

National Care Service Consultation

The LMC agreed a response to the Scottish Government's National Care Service Consultation on Monday evening. This has been submitted. The LMC's response was focussed on the proposed change of health boards holding GP contracts to these being held by the proposed community health and social care boards. The consultation can be found <u>here</u>. Responses need to be submitted by 2nd November.
