To All GPs and GP Practices

Welcome to our 6th LMC Covid communication. It has been a busy time and we thank GP practices for staying open on the May public holiday this week.

Feedback from GPs and from practices indicate that workload is increasing. The public messaging about seeking medical help when needed is hitting home. Practices face the double challenge of adapting new ways of working to the steady increase in patient contacts whilst maintaining the need for social distancing for staff and patients to ensure safe working.

LMC Year End and Covid-19 Meetings

We held evening meetings this week for GPs and practice managers across GGC. We had over 230 attendees across the 3 Zoom meetings. Thank you for participating in these virtual meetings and we hope you found them informative and stimulating. It was good to see so many familiar faces in the Zoom meeting.

Self-referral to Testing for GGC Health and Social Care Staff

GPs and practice staff can now arrange testing directly, for either themselves, or household members with symptoms (first 5 days of fever of \geq 37.8 C or new persistent cough), using the self-referral e-form. <u>Staff Testing Self-Referral Form</u>

Whilst GPs and staff are waiting for the appointment and test results, it is important that they and household contacts follow the guidance on self-isolation on the <u>NHS Inform website</u>.

PPE/CPR Statement from BMA Scotland

<u>BMA Scotland have released a statement</u> on its position on PPE usage when performing chest compressions in the current Covid-19 situation. The LMC / GP subcommittee supports the BMA position and refers you to it. The BMA has recognised the Resuscitation Council UK guidance that chest compressions should require Level 3 PPE and consideration of the place of defibrillation in resuscitation in the current situation. The BMA guidance states that where the appropriate PPE is not available, doctors must balance the risk to their own health with the likelihood of chest compressions being effective for the patient.

Recovery Phase and new GP Contract

We are beginning the process of returning to discussions about the GP Contract and Phase 1. There has been no change to the national GP Contract and the MOU. PCIP implementation understandably took a back seat with the pandemic response over the past 2 months but we are restarting our work with HSCPs and the Board on this issue. Ways of working for practices and NHS staff have changed since March and we may need adapt how the PCIP services will be delivered in practices.
