To All GPs and GP Practices

A very Happy New Year to GPs and practice staff across GGC. We hope you were able to have a rest over the festive break. We are extremely grateful to all colleagues who have worked, and are continuing to work, in the CACs and OOHs service over these challenging weeks.

This is the 46th edition of our Covid Comms newsletter. We hope that GPs and practices are finding them useful. Hundreds of documents that have been issued by the board have been collated within our newsletters. GPs who wish to receive our newsletters directly to their personal email addresses, should advise the office of this.

LMC Covid Workload Survey

We know that the current surge in Covid cases and changes in both the Covid Community Pathway as well as the updates to testing and self-isolation will be impacting on general practice workload. The LMC is concerned, that workload related to managing acute Covid and suspected Covid illness, is no longer being captured as it moves into GP practices. It is very important to support and represent the interests of practices locally and nationally, to be able to evidence the workload burden that managing acute Covid illness in the community is causing practices. Currently only the remote triage hub and CACs are able to provide evidence of activity.

We recognise that managing persisting symptoms of Covid illness, and Long Covid, also cause practice workload but in this survey, we are particularly interested in capturing workload related to acute presentations of Covid or suspected Covid – broadly defined as cases requiring self-isolation.

We have therefore designed a very simple weekly survey intended to run over the course of January, and we would be grateful for your participation. We have kept the questions as light and broad-brush as possible. What we are asking GPs and nurses to capture are the following 2 areas of work-

- 1. The total number of cases that you deal with that have required an in-person consultation (i.e. face to face in surgery or home visit) arising from Covid or suspected Covid illness.
- 2. The total number of cases that you deal with by remote consultation (e.g telephone or online) arising from Covid or suspected Covid illness.

Here is a sample desk top proforma for collecting this information which we hope you will find useful. We ask that all clinicians dealing with patient presentations are given a proforma for the relevant week, and that the completed proformas are collected and collated by the practice manager, who then completes the Survey Monkey and return to the LMC on a weekly basis on behalf of their practice. No data will be attributed to individual practices and the activity related to Covid illness will be made available in meetings to boards and HSCPs in the same format that it will be provided in a report within the LMC Comms- which will be in the form of total consultations, in person and remote, reported by GP practices in the board area on a week-by-week basis. When this information has been extracted from each weekly survey the returns will be deleted.

Updated Self-Isolation Guidance

The policy document for health and social care staff was updated on 6th January 2022. The update to the rules for returning to work for staff following close contact with a positive Covid-19 case follows on from the First Minister announcement on 5th January for the general population. Covid - Proof of Recovery

Practices are receiving requests for proof that patients have recovered from Covid for travel purposes. This would not be GMS work. It would be private work, so practices can decide if they wish to do it, and also what private fee should be charged if they do. If GPs do undertake this work privately, then it is important to ensure that the GP has appropriate indemnity cover and following the GMC's Good Medical Practice guidance which states- "You must recognise and work within the limits of your competence." and, "You must be honest and trustworthy when writing reports, and when completing or signing forms, reports and other documents."

GP Subcommittee/LMC Election

The election for the GP Subcommittee and LMC is ongoing. GPs will have received papers from the board about this.

2022 Public Holidays

We are aware that practices require the list of public holidays for this year and are seeking to ensure this is provided as soon as possible. We are still waiting on confirmation on the full set of dates applicable for GP practices.

The Board has published the public holidays for NHS employed staff on their website.
